UNESCO activities

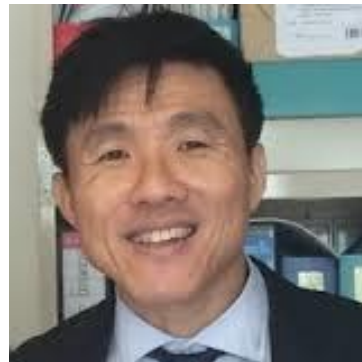
- To set up a research framework to evaluate the impact of the UNESCO educational resources

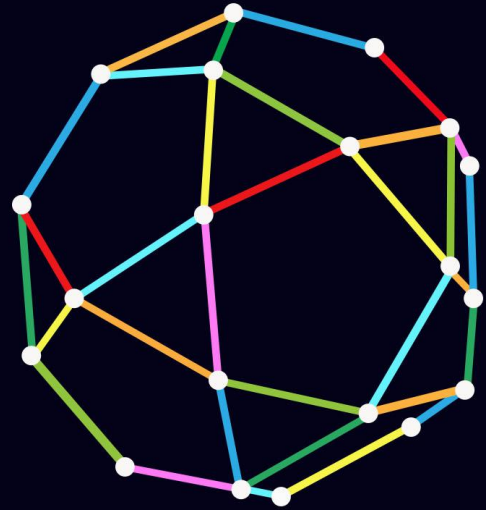
